Soon there was a stagecoach serving the area's transportation needs and a stage stop located near a lone pine tree on a rolling Palouse hill. The stage stop became a town and began to grow until the railroads arrived and needed the land. Soon the town was gone leaving only the town's Lone Pine Cemetery. It is now a cemetery without a town and has been almost forgotten.
