The Birdsell Family

Two Birdsell children are buried at Lone Pine Cemetery. Information on the stones give little information except they were the children of J.P.& O.G. Birdsell. One died in 1897, an infant son, no age or name given, the other was their daughter Hellen, who died at seven weeks old on March, 1, 1904.

Information gleaned from the census search in Ancestry.com shows Justin P. Birdsell was born in 1867 in Iowa to Benjamin and Mary Birdell. In the 1870 census they lived in Frankville, Winneshiek County, Iowa. Listed were five Children, Henry E. age 8, Sarah E. age 6, Agnes E. age 4, **Justin age 3**, and Ellen G. age 8 months. In 1880 the family still lived in Franksville with four additional children but Ellen was not in the Census. The added children were Genever A. age 10, Esther T. age 8, Curtis age 3, and Leavitt age 5 months.

The next available census was 1900 which showed Justin age 33 married to Octavia G. age 22, married in 1896 and living in Lone Pine, Whitman County with two children, Mary L. age 2 and Leonard R. age 1 month.

In 1910 Justin and Octavia were shown living at Lower Dry Creek in Walla Walla County with four children, Leone N. age 11, (?), Leonard R. Age 10, Lester B. age 8, June T. age 1. Mary L. is missing from this census.

In 1930, Justin now age 52 is shown as a widower living in Cambridge, Washington County, Idaho with his son Leonard age 19.



Note; the 1940 census will be available some time in 2012.
